MEET OUR NEW CEO

Annie Phillips



Youngstown Area Goodwill Industries, along with its board of directors, proudly announced Ann Phillips as the new CEO of the Youngstown nonprofit in June. The board of directors named Phillips as their selection after Phillips acted as interim CEO for the prior four months. The term followed the resignation of former CEO, Mark Goloja, in February.

"As the board, it's our honor and privilege to name Ann Phillips CEO," said HaSheen Wilson, board president. "Phillips has continuously demonstrated her ability to simultaneously lead and follow, which is an exceptional attribute in being an effective leader. Ann's laser focus to details, ability to simplify and communicate complex information and situations, while keeping her sights on the future made her a clear choice to lead Goodwill through our next era."

Since joining Youngstown Area Goodwill, Phillips has served the organization through her work in many roles. She began in an entry-level position in 2018, and, after a six-month departure, returned in 2019 to a grants and data management role. She was promoted to Assistant Controller, and shortly after, added the title of Director of Retail, until transitioning into the roles of chief operating officer and chief financial officer. In addition to the interim CEO role, Phillips most recently served the organization as chief operating officer and chief missions officer. She holds a BSBA and MAcc from Youngstown State University.



Phillips says Goodwill has so much to offer and plans to continue focusing on workforce development in the community.



While Ms. O continues to work in textiles, a few years ago, our Missions department asked her to also join the Radio Reading team. Ms. O says she loves working in Radio Reading and loves that every day is a new challenge. Her favorite aspect is working closely with our volunteers.

In addition these roles, Ms. O also works as a phone receptionist for Goodwill. As she continues to learn in all of her

one thing has remained a constant: she has worked with individuals who are visually impaired for more than 30 years. YOUNGSTOWN RADIO READING SERVICE CELEBRATES 30 YEARS AT GOODWILL



In March, the Youngstown Radio Reading Service celebrated its 30 year anniversary at Youngstown Area Goodwill Industries. YRRS, which celebrated 45 years of broadcasting in 2021, is a special non-profit radio station dedicated to providing independent access to information for people who are blind or print impaired. YRRS operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week, airing a variety of original interview shows and special-interest programs on top of content from newspapers, magazines and books, read by volunteers.

"What our Radio Reading service has accomplished is extraordinary," said Annie Phillips, interim CEO. "Our YRRS team is made up of a group of dedicated individuals who are enthusiastic about executing the mission of Youngstown Goodwill and Radio Reading."

Originally part of the Youngstown Society for the Blind and Disabled, YRRS began broadcasting in 1976 and operated for two years on the Youngstown State University campus before moving to studios at YSBD in 1978. When YSBD closed in 1992, YRRS moved to its current location at Youngstown Goodwill's corporate offices on Belmont Avenue, where it has been for the past three decades.

"There was a lot of unknowns when we came over from the Society of the Blind and Disabled in 1992," said Mike Bosela, who was Radio Reading Coordinator when the service transferred to Goodwill until 2018. He still works in the department as a Radio Reading Broadcast Tech. "I soon learned that Goodwill was a nurturing, understanding and welcoming environment. We were positioned to succeed, and thanks to the staff, we all have continued to do so."
