Meet William! Known by many around Goodwill as Mr. Crockett, William joined our organization as a baler in August of 2021. He quickly learned the ropes and became an important part of the team and, over time, helped train new team members on the role. William explained he loves learning new things and growing as a person, and this led him to transition to our e-commerce department in March. There, he has worked on many assignments to assist our online stores, mainly focusing on scanning books.

William was born and raised in Youngstown, and his community-mindedness is one of the aspects that draws him to working at Goodwill. "I am able to utilize the skills I need to make sure I am an asset to not only Goodwill, but the community as a whole."

William said the Goodwill staff is wonderful and helps him recognize his own abilities.

"The managers show concern for me and notice my effort and help in ways that see my potential."



Meet Tammy! Tammy is a Youngstown native and has been a sorter with us for the past two years. At the time, she was looking to rejoin the workforce and found the perfect job opportunity with Goodwill. Tammy joined the organization, helping to sort through donations, quality check items and separate merchandise based on department. She said she enjoys working at Goodwill and has learned more about clothing brands and how to recognize quality items. "It's a nice place to work," she said. "They work with you and help people with disabilities."

When asked what her favorite part of the job was, Tammy quickly responded, "My team."

"The thing that keeps me coming back here is the people," she added. "The people are very friendly, and I've gained a lot of friends."

Meet Otho Mae! Also known as Ms. O, she joined Goodwill when the Society of the Blind closed in 1992. She became part of our contract services team and worked to become the department supervisor. She handled quality control, helped train co-workers and managed the services. After contracts, she stayed with Goodwill and transferred to our textiles department.

While Ms. O continues to work in textiles, a few years ago, our Missions department asked her to also join the Radio Reading team. Ms. O says she loves working in Radio Reading and loves that every day is a new challenge. Her favorite aspect is working closely with our volunteers.

In addition these roles, Ms. O also works as a phone receptionist for Goodwill. As she continues to learn in all of her positions, one thing has remained a constant: she has worked with individuals who are visually impaired for more than 30 years.

She encourages anyone struggling with their vision to find a volunteer opportunity, job or hobby. "Although you have lost your sight, there is something out there for you to do to make you feel independent and useful. Keep pushing," she said.
